Vanessa has donated some of her ward budget to Kents Hill and Monkston Parish Council, who will replace the **grit bin at Eridge Green** in **Kents Hill**.



Milton Keynes City Council have agreed to replace the bin at **Rockspray Grove, Walnut Tree**.

Jenni has helped disabled residents across the ward who have assisted collections get their bins returned to their property after emptying.

Pavement Woes

Duncan measures the dip in the pavement at **Huckleberry Close, Walnut Tree** after a resident was injured tripping up on it. He has asked MK Council to repair it.



Borrow It!



Milton Keynes City Council has opened a "Library of Things" where residents can borrow costly items that they only need occasionally. It is hosted in the Frank Moran Centre, in Bletchley.

Cllr Jane Carr, Cabinet Member for Cost of Living issues, says "The library offers everything from vacuum cleaners and dehumidifiers to sewing machines and party kits. People can borrow them for free to use for up to two weeks."

Update on Developments

- Residents have asked about a number of sites:
- Lindisfarne Drive Monkston - care home - finalising the legal agreements
 - Walton Manor - housing - just being marketed so expect plans this winter.
 - The OU move - they will make their next stage decision this summer. If they do move, we won't know definite plans for the site at Walton Hall for several years.
